Unforgettable Dancing

If you missed seeing the Grupo Corpo Brazilian Dance Theater at the Granada, you missed one of the smashes of the UCSB Arts & Lectures season

The 19 dancers were, in a word, sensational.

Never have I enjoyed a contemporary dance performance so much given the turbo-charged, exhilarating and creative choreography that made the two-hour show just fly by.

Performing two very different, but seamless pieces, "Parabelo" – a decidedly Brazilian creation with an exuberant and rhythmic beat and devotional chants – and a more recent creation, "Ima," with the stage's constant alternation between full and empty, the performers went full throttle with the sensuality of Afro-Brazilian dance forms, the liquid swing of jazz and the technical prowess of ballet, with abundant energy to burn.

The choreography by **Rodrigo Pederneiras** was stylish, unique and unforgettable.

With colorful theatrical effects and a pulsing beat, it is to be hoped the 36-year-old company, which was making its Santa Barbara debut, comes back to our Eden by the Beach sooner rather than later.
